A friend once asked, "Why is it that when you have lost your keys, you always find

them in the last place you look?" Though the question was amusing, I really did not desire a philosophical conversation, so I looked at him with a disinterested expression. Noting this friend wasn't going to go away until I responded, I finally said, "I don't know." He said, "Because when you find your keys you stop looking."

On another occasion, this same friend came into my office ecstatic about his newfound understanding of electricity. He said, "Electricity is smoke." I said, "Excuse me?" not quite believing what I just heard, but indeed I heard correctly, electricity is smoke. He explained, "Have you ever noticed that when the smoke gets out of an electrical appliance, it stops working?" This stroke of analytical brilliance was truly funny, and yet, to someone who knows nothing about electricity, this explanation would make perfect sense. Of course, my friend was joking; however, we can learn something from these examples of debatable profundity.

The "lost keys" illustration concludes with a true statement. We stop looking as soon as we find what we're looking for, so it makes sense that what we are looking for will always be found at the last place we look. Innocuous as it may seem, applying the same logic to seeking answers in the Bible may produce wrong answers that may also have serious consequences. For example, a seeker may ask, "How can I be saved?" The seeker begins searching the Bible and the first applicable verse found is James 3:24, "So you see, a man is saved by what he does, as well as what he believes." (LB) Without studying the entire counsel of God, that seeker might never discover that salvation is by faith alone – he will always believe what he thinks he has discovered, that works righteousness is the way to gain entrance in to the kingdom of God. Remember what the Apostle Paul wrote in his letter to the church at Rome, "But now a righteousness from God, apart from the law, has been made known, to which the law and the prophets testify. This righteousness from God, comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe." (Romans 3:21-22 NIV) Only by studying the entire Bible, can we begin truly to understand what God is telling us.

The "electricity is smoke" example can teach us to be careful about how we act and react to another person's understanding of God's Word. We must never take for granted that a person reading the Bi-

ble will correctly understand the meaning of a particular text. Using the above example, we must gently teach the seeker who now believes in works righteousness (that electricity is smoke) that salvation comes through faith and our works are a means of completing that faith, that righteous action is evidence of genuine faith. Our task is always to show mercy

and grace while tenderly teaching those who are struggling for understanding, or have misunderstood what was written.

After all, we were all beginners at one point in time, and even to this day, we often struggle with the meaning of certain passages. We should never allow ourselves to become a detriment to others seeking understanding. Rather, "Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification" (Rom. 14:19 NIV), and "encourage one another and build each other up"(1 Thes. 5:11 NIV).

Property and Investment Management/Trustees (Barbara Little, Chair)

- At the August 10th meeting after 8:30 service, the consensus was to go forward with a new projection system in the sanctuary while retaining the sanctity of the sanctuary.
- CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING
- Trustees are getting quotes on installing two ceiling fans in the fellowship hall.
- There is a plan to work on the musty smell in the choir room now that the HVAC unit has been repaired and is working correctly to manage humidity/moisture.
- A Fall Clean Up Day has been scheduled on October 11th (8am)
- The Merrill Lynch rep for the Trustee funds wants to change the investment plan for the Parsonage Fund to be a bit more aggressive (we made this type of change for the other Trustee funds and have made a good return).
- All HVAC units have been serviced this summer.
- We are getting an estimate to trim back the magnolia trees in the front courtyard (tops and sides).

Mission and Ministry Team (No Chair/No Meeting)

- Garrett Shull reported on VBS
 - We had 40 students registered
 - The students were mostly from our Sunday School, but some were from other churches, neighbors, or grandchildren too.
 - Garrett has debriefed with volunteers as to what we will change for next year
 - The kids had a great deal of fun! (As did the adults!)
 - 25-30 volunteers run this ministry and it's a wonderful church activity
- Garrett is putting together a fall Youth event for the congregation
- Per Amanda Dean
 - the Blessing of the Backpacks is Sept 7th (first day of SS)
 - Sunday School Classes will be a good size again this year and we will have classes for pre-school through high school ages.
 - We are staffed for teachers (although we could use substitutes)
 - We have 17-20 students in MS/HS class

Fund Management Team (Bob Wiley, Treasurer)

- Bob is revising the format of the monthly report by categorizing expenses into like categories so that the council can get a more accurate picture of what gets spent overall on facility, staffing, evangelism/education, and operational expenses.
- He is concerned with offerings to date, which are behind the expected weekly amount.
- We will make adjustments as needed in the 2026 budget (based on any changes in offerings and expenses in 2025)
- We should look at reducing electric costs with the 10% reduction offer from solar company. Carrie will call for more information and will forward it to PD and Bob.

Staff Parish Relations Team (Laura Patrick, Chair)

- We have hired David Cherry as a pianist/music director for the 8:30am service! Hooray! He starts in September. He can work with a choir eventually if there is interest.
- We will review the SafeMinistry children's policies from GMC and make sure we are implementing those ASAP.

New Business

 - The 2025 Charge Conference is December 4th at 6pm. PD will send out information out this week that leadership needs to complete
 - NE Conf is seeking a Prayer Point Person from each church to work with the district. Will put the job description out in the midweek letter.
