REPORT

FINANCIAL

This year, the Lenten season begins Wednesday February 17. We will mark this time with an Ash Wednesday Service at 7:00pm. This season continues for 40 days, not including Sundays, and ends on Holy Saturday, that is the Saturday before Easter, April 3.

The word "Lent" derives from the anglo-saxon term *lencten*, meaning "spring." During this time we earnestly recount all that God accomplished through the work of Jesus Christ. We experience this period every year in the life of the church,



but often, we forget, or sometimes we never knew what this time of year is about. The Dictionary for United Methodists defines Lent as a forty-day period of focus on penitence

and preparation for the Resurrection Event of Easter. Today, we tend to observe Lent as a time of penance, by abstaining from festivals, by almsgiving, and by devoting more than the usual time to exercises of the faith. In recent years, more emphasis has been placed on these aspects than the physical fasting that marked this season in the early church. This month, our focus is on Ash Wednesday.

Ashes are a sign of mortality and repentance. The uses of ashes dates

back to ancient Jewish tradition and often were associated with sacrifices, mourning, and fasting. A person would properly express grief, humiliation, and repentance by sitting in ashes or placing them on their head. See 2nd Samuel 13:19; Esther 4:1-4; Matthew 11:21 for examples of this custom.

At one time, during the early centuries of the church, public penitents at Rome were ceremonially admitted on this day to begin their penance. This ceremony fell into disuse between the eighth and tenth centuries as general penance of the entire congregation began to take place. This penance was symbolized through the imposition of ashes.

Another use for ashes in the early church (2nd century) included a regular ceremony of public confession and penance. This use had acquired so much significance that Tertullian (a prolific early Christian author from Carthage in the Roman province of Africa) spoke of "the substitution of sackcloth and ashes for a man's usual habit."

Penitents under excommunication used to sprinkle their heads with ashes and ask those who were permitted to enter the church for prayers of restoration to the Communion. Ashes symbolized the sincerity of the penitent and their desire to be "right with God."

Today, ashes symbolize the same meanings though the ceremonial customs have since vanished. The one exception to this is Ash Wednesday.

The United Methodist Book of Worship states that "Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The form and the content of the service focus on the themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ...and the imposition of ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation."

Ash Wednesday is a serious but blessed means to begin the Lenten season. I pray you can participate in our upcoming service.

St. Luke's UMC Fiscal Year 2020 Treasurer's Report

The events of 2020 have impacted St. Luke's and our community in many ways. We've dealt with worship restrictions, separation, illness, anxiety and financial stress. I realized many of you may not be aware of how your continued faithful financial support has allowed us to maintain our viability as a functioning church. I believe our church family honors 2 Corinthians 9:7 "Each of you should give what you have decided in our heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." I also believe giving isn't about God needing our money; it's about Him wanting to be first in our lives.

There are many opportunities for giving at St. Luke's. Following is a summary of activity in all our financial accounts:

General Fund Income and Expense Report is published monthly in the Voice. The year-end data show us that budget offerings were at 93.3% and expenses at 89.6%. It is important to note that through October we were at \$20,000 cash flow loss. Along with year-end giving and cutting operating costs where possible we ended the year with \$9,600 gain.

The 2021 budget for General Fund is 10% lower than 2020. We accomplished this by evaluating every line item for opportunities to save without hindering our mission. Winterizing the parsonage and the Trustees plan for sale of the house are included in the expense savings. Proceeds from the house sale will be set aside in a protected investment account for future use if needed for a parsonage.

<u>Special Accounts</u> are designated funds for items such as MYF, Backpack Fund, Neighbors United To Serve (NUTS), Woven Women Ministry, Operation Christmas Child, REACH, UMCOR, and VBS. These funds are disbursed as programs need them and are an opportunity to give in addition to general funds. The December balance in the account was \$20,997. (Continued on next page).

Memorial Funds are both designated and undesignated bequests honoring the loss of loved ones. There are 15 accounts including Camp Pecometh Scholarships, Organ, Sunday school, Nursery, Music, Choir Robes, Hand bells, Technology, and Landscaping. An example of spending is using funds designated for technology upgrades for our Sunday school. This is an on-going project. In 2020 the account had income of \$6,675 and disbursed \$8,208 leaving an ending balance of \$34,751.

<u>United Methodist Women (UMW)</u> income is derived from sales of nuts, Easter eggs, Easter and Christmas flowers, and annual Pledge/Prayer & Self Denial campaign. Covid-19 prevented Easter egg income, our biggest source of funds. Donations were made to several outreach programs including Samaritan House, Compass Regional Hospital, Board of Child Care, Denton Child Development Center, and Pastor's Discretionary Fund. December balance in checking account was \$13,719 and CD investment \$7,015.

<u>Pastor's Discretionary Fund</u> income is derived from designated church offerings and UMW donations. The fund is a benevolence set aside for the pastor to use at his discretion to meet the needs of requests from the community or church members. All the funds are managed with confidentiality and are used for items such as rent, utility bills, transportation, and medical costs. The winter months create the biggest demand for help. The December balance was \$8,750.

Again, thank you church family for your faithfulness.
